



This week at Braunstone Community Primary School...

Foundation 1, Class 1

The children in nursery have been learning all about autumn. They have enjoyed counting with conkers and talking about where they come from. We have been busy printing with leaves and using them to decorate our mud cakes in the outdoor environment.

The children have also enjoyed using the instruments to make different sounds as we re-tell the story of the Bear Hunt; "We're not scared!" We've had so much fun repeating key phrases from the book and going on our pretend adventure looking for the big bear!

Foundation 2, Class RBE & RDM

In classes RBE and RDM we have been learning how to count objects one at a time and how we write numerals. We have been looking at a 'Super Silly Pasta' recipe and have been counting out the correct quantity of each ingredient. We have also begun to focus on our whole class shared writing. The children have worked very hard to write familiar sight words.

Next week we will begin to find out about 3D shapes, focusing on the properties of spheres and cubes. We have loved seeing lots more book bags brought to school this week and the children have been excited to read with the adults in their class!

<u> Year 1, Class 1CE & 1CK</u>

In Year One, we have been Teeth Defenders this week. We have been looking at how we have two sets of teeth: baby and adult teeth. We also looked at how important oral hygiene is and how to brush our teeth. We even got to practise on big model teeth!

Some of our pupils in Class 1CK chose to make some posters to make others aware of brushing our teeth to stop decay and cavities. We did so well that Dr Rabbit from the Teeth Defenders gave us all our own toothbrush and toothpaste!

Year 2, Class 2DF & 2RL

The Year 2 children are continuing to work hard and last week completed their narrative of Finding Nemo.

In Maths, the children have begun to show a good understanding of place value and this week will be moving on to addition. They have also worked hard to learn their 10 times tables.

The children look forward to a Thursday as they love going swimming each week. Now that they have the confidence to move safely in and around the pool, they are starting to learn the skills to swim.

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Attendance

Whole school attendance should be 96.4% or above as set by the Government. We have high expectations for all our pupils and have set a school and individual target of 97%. Our current attendance year-to-date is 96.3%, we are delighted to see that it is improving, with improved punctuality and attendance this will continue to increase and help us to continue to reach our target. We know that the more children come to school, the more they learn and the more successful they will be at school.

Looking at our data for this academic year so far we can see that a significant number of absences are due to unauthorised leave (i.e. holidays being taken during term time) - please be advised that any holidays taken during term time will be unauthorised and you could be issued with a Penalty Notice of £120 per parent per child (discounted to £60 if paid within 21 days), or, your case could be referred by the Local Authority directly to the Magistrates' Court.

If we receive no communication from you, we are legally required to record a mark of unauthorised absence; this could result in the Education Welfare Office being contacted.

Medical appointments

Please, where possible, avoid routine medical appointments within school time. Every second of learning counts!

If your child is absent for a medical reason you will need to provide medical evidence e.g. appointment card/clinic letter or appointment confirmation text sent by the NHS.
