<u>Year 3, Class 3HD & 3MS</u>

Year 3 kicked off their "Life in Roman Britain" topic in style this week by making their own shield and using it in the Year 3 army to conquer the playground! We will be looking in depth at how the Romans transformed Britain and what life was like for a 7 year old in Roman Britain. The children will then use their knowledge to write a discussion text about joining the Roman Empire.

In English we are using "Talk For Writing" to learn how to retell a story and then write our own narrative about a journey. In Maths the children will be learning how to multiply by 3's, 4's and 8's. A perfect opportunity to practice and apply their times table knowledge."

<mark>Year 4, Class 4RA & 4JG</mark>

This week has seen Year 4 learn more about the Stone Age, practice some 3-digit multiplication, pass loads of reading quizzes and begin to understand states of matter. The first weeks of term have been amazing and we are really looking forward to the rest of this half term. Keep an eye out for us making tools, writing on the school website, experimenting with particles and becoming experts at the ukulele.

<u>Year 5, Class 5EP, 5NC & 5LF</u>

In English we have used our acting and drawing skills to teach us how to write an alien report. Ask us about these, we are really proud! 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The Diwali festival represents the symbolic victory of light over darkness, knowledge over ignorance, and good over evil.


<u> Parents Evening- November 2018</u>

<u>Attendance</u>

Whole school attendance should be 96.4% or above as set by the Government. We have high expectations for all our pupils and have set a school and individual target of 97%. Our current attendance year-to-date is 96.25% we are delighted to see that it is improving, with improved punctuality and attendance this will continue to increase and help us to continue to reach our target. We know that the more children come to school, the more they learn and the more successful they will be at school.

Looking at our data for this academic year so far we can see that a significant number of absences are due to unauthorised leave (i.e. holidays being taken during term time) - please be advised that any holidays taken during term time will be unauthorised **and you could be issued** with a Penalty Notice of £120 per parent per child (discounted to £60 if paid within 21 days), or, your case could be referred by the Local Authority directly to the Magistrates' Court.

If we receive no communication from you, we are legally required to record a mark of unauthorised absence; this could result in the Education Welfare Office being contacted.

<u>Medical appointments</u>

Please, where possible, avoid routine medical appointments within school time. Every second of learning counts!

If your child is absent for a medical reason you will need to provide medical evidence e.g. appointment card/clinic letter or appointment confirmation text sent by the NHS.
