



FS1 have been counting to 5 and beyond and using objects to represent each numeral. They have also been using different methods to practice writing their names and learning some new sight words.





Foundation Stage 2 —Oak and Willow Class


EYFS have been practicing how to write letters and words this week. They have been exploring the number 7 and using numicon shapes to help with their understanding of numbers.




Year 1

In maths, the children were learning to add by making 10 using tens frames and counters to support them.










Year 2

animals using their writing skills.








Year 3


