
# Stars of the Week and Most Improved

### Times Tables Rock Stars—Battle of the Bands






### FS2—Oak and Willow Class


The children in FS2 have been exploring the number 8 this week and finding different ways to make 8. They have also been sounding out and writing words using the sounds they have learnt in phonics.





#### Year 1

#### Year 4




#### Year 5






#### Dragons
