



We had special assemblies from a scientist who showed and shared with the children magnificent things about space, including how gravity can be altered. The children took part in many scientific investigations from how far can you project a rocket to understanding that the Milky Way is constantly changing, expanding and developing! We explored the effect of whether the shape of a meteor has an impact on the size of the crater it creates when landing on the moon. The children explored space in virtual reality with the use of our headsets.



Year 3

The year 3 children have been continuing to develop their fluency skills with by understanding the role of the equals symbol. They used weighted Base 10 equipment to identify when the balance pans are equivalent.




National Poetry Day
